

Ganllwyd Community Council.

You may be aware that the council provides an annual report of the main issues dealt by them during the previous financial year and a brief summary of its plans for the upcoming year.

During the 2017/18 financial year the council has conducted its business in the shadow of financial cuts originating from central government.

The financial cuts have resulted in the council having to find other means to raise finance without passing a seemingly increasing financial burden on people within the community.

The opportunity to raise extra finances appeared when event organisers from the Coed y Brenin complex asked if the council representatives together with friends and colleagues would provide marshals' during race day events.

As a result of the request a partnership was formed between the council and event organisers at Coed y Brenin.

The community council have also formed a partnership with Gwynedd Council to ensure that the toilet located in the village remains open.

The community council provides a percentage of funding towards the running cost of the toilet.

The funding provided by Gwynedd Council towards the maintenance of local footpaths and bridleways was slashed to £577 for the year.

The community council provided a further £200 towards the cost of footpath maintenance.

In order to generate local interaction, the community council have set up their own website.
